Uniform Rules *New*

Waitaha Club Information 2025

In 2025, we are implementing a uniform rule. The following clothing at training is acceptable;

Tops – Sports bras/singlets/t–shirts/long sleeves (not baggy)

Bottoms – bike shorts, activewear skort or tights

Alternatives – Activewear tennis dress w/ shorts attached, activewear one–piece/onesie, training leotard.

Strictly no denim, no school uniforms or loose, baggy clothing

Hair must be tied up including fringes/bangs. Hair must be of the face and secure.

Skaters must be warmed up, with skates on 5 minutes prior to class starting, unless coaches have been informed otherwise.



Information for Parents

Roller Skates

For those beginning their journey at the KiwiSkate level, we offer skate hire to make it easy to get started. While protective gear is not mandatory at this stage, we do encourage safety as a priority. As skaters progress to the Star Class level and beyond, owning personal skates becomes essential. This ensures that skaters have the right equipment to support their development and performance. For those aiming to compete, purchasing artistic roller skates is crucial. These skates provide the necessary ankle support and stability required for jumps, spins and footwork. Without the right gear, skaters may find themselves limited in their abilities and at risk of an increase in injuries. Investing in specific skates is a key step in the sport of roller skating.

Skate brands with the tick of approval from us:

Impalas - For skaters under 50kg. These are not practical skates for adults due to structural integrety). These can be found at sports/surf shops or their online store.

The Seed Project - For all skaters from beginners through until Whetu level. Purchase through their website or Skaters Edge

Edea - Purchase second hand online or direct from Skaters Edge

Risport - Purchase second hand online or direct from Skaters Edge

Growth Mindset

Having a positive attitude and a growth mindset is essential for success and enjoyment. Roller skating, like any sport, comes with its challenges and setbacks. Commitment

Commitment is an essential part of your skater's journey. It means attending practice regularly, striving for improvement, and staying focused on their goals. This dedication not only supports their growth and discipline but also helps them overcome challenges and enjoy the sport to its fullest.

From experience, we've seen that when skaters miss consecutive training sessions, they can miss crucial information, making it harder for them to keep up. Consistency truly is key to their success and development.

Class Structure

Waitaha is structured through group lessons. Each group accomodates similar level skaters. KiwiSkate and Whetū Classes are run by CAC Coaches Sam and Emma, with higher grades from Novice through to Senior coaches by Alana Caunter. Coach accreditation is encouraged for all skaters over the age of 14, or interested supporters/parents.

Private Lessons

For competitive skaters, we have private lessons throughout the development season (August to February) to create and choreograph routines, followed by one-off privates when required. If your skater requires Private lessons outside out our current club structure by either Same, Emma or Alana, hall hire and coaching fees are to be paid for by the skater/whanau. Private coaching only is no longer an effeciant way of teaching artistic roller skating and groups are recommended for all disciplines, however we do understand individuals require additional supports. This can be discussed with the head coach prior to the season or classes starting.
